

In the spirit of giving and the holiday season, Department would like to share the amazing efforts of our LVAP Volunteers at the Chapter level.

Jessie Martinez Chapter #50 proudly partnered with 20 Active Duty personnel from Schriever AFB to help veterans who need projects done around their homes. The Active Duty personnel cleaned up around the veteran's home, the yard and garage—enough to fill a 20-yard dumpster. They painted the fence on the veterans 1/2-acre property. They dismantled and threw away several rotten wooden garden boxes and removed all the tall weeds. They mowed the backyard and trimmed around the trees, house and fence. They also cleaned the garage and painted the trim around the garage and front door. They worked all day. Their NCOIC came in the early morning and looked to see the magnitude of work in front of the volunteers. "They were such a joy and worked as a team to help Larry" said Jim Beckham who was the point of contact for the day. He further stated "The group had a positive attitude and it was nice to see the smiles on their faces. I commend them for their service and the volunteer work they do to help disabled veterans. Golden Corral has been a wonderful supporter of the military community – providing millions of free meals to veterans and servicemembers, and contributing millions of dollars to support veteran organizations. Here are a few amazing facts about Golden Corrals' support:
