To: Chapter Americanism Chairman c/o Adjt.:

The Department is again sponsoring an "Americanism Essay Contest" this upcoming year and DAV State Commander John Lamphere expects all Chapters to participate!

Please have your Chapter Americanism Chairman contact your local elementary schools and make arrangements for your chapter to "Sponsor a Classroom Americanism Essay Contest." The essay subject the students will be writing about is "What America's veterans mean to me..."

The contest is limited to 5th grade elementary students ONLY.

Contact each school principal for program clearance (See "SAMPLE LETTER" on the reverse side of this letter — to be sent out for you by the Department.)

The general guidelines for the project utilize the 5<sup>th</sup> grade students' research, writing and creative skills. It's an opportunity for the students to gain recognition for their skills. As well as presenting them with the opportunity to obtain a bond for themselves, and a grant for the school. Allow the classroom teacher to establish specific ground rules for conducting the program, including the selection of judges.

The chapter should determine what prizes will be awarded to the local 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place winners. Arrange an awards ceremony with the classroom teacher and principal. Have chapter members attend the ceremony. If possible, take pictures at the ceremony for publicity purposes, or invite a local newspaper to attend the ceremony to cover the event.

See that your local program is completed by <u>Friday, April 2, 2010</u> to allow you enough time to submit the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place essays to the Department office for consideration in the Statewide sponsored "Americanism Essay Contest" where a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place winning entry will be selected.

Your first and second place winning essays should be submitted to the Department office **NO LATER THAN Friday, April 9, 2010**. In addition, please provide the following information on the students who place first and second place locally: Name and address of school; the student's name, address and telephone number. We will be purchasing U.S. Savings bonds for the winners.

Review the contents of the enclosed "Sample Letter" and complete the "Return Notice" form and mail it into the Department office so that a letter can be sent out for you.
