### **Life Science Anatomical**

Thank you, Mr. Rapoport, for introducing the important idea of considering all available options for end-of-life planning. One such option is the Southern Nevada Veterans Memorial Cemetery (702-486-5920), where eligible Veterans may be interred at no cost and spouses for a 450 dollar fee. This includes the cemetery plot, opening and closing of the grave, a concrete vault, headstone, and perpetual care. Another thoughtful option that Mr. Rapoport shared is Life Science Anatomical, an organization that allows individuals to donate their bodies to medical research and education.
