

Veteran Travel Benefit

Under the Veterans Expedited TSA Screening (VETS) Safe Travel Act,

Certain Veterans may now qualify for TSA PreCheck enrollment at no cost. TSA PreCheck allows travelers to use expedited security screening lanes at participating airports, often reducing wait times and allowing travelers to keep on their belts, light jackets, etc., during screening.

According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, eligibility is currently limited to Veterans who:

- * Have a qualifying service-connected disability requiring the use of a VA-issued wheelchair or prosthetic limb due to loss or loss of use of an extremity, paralysis, or permanent blindness;
- * Are enrolled in VA health care; and Meet TSA's standard citizenship, security, and background check requirements.

Veterans who meet the eligibility criteria should have received a notification letter from the VA. The letter can also be accessed through a VA.gov account and must be provided during the TSA Pre-Check enrollment process. Enrollment fee waivers are subject to available funding.
